DID YOU KNOW?

- Diabetes is the fifth deadliest disease in the US. The estimated annual economic cost of diabetes in 2002 was \$132 billion, or one out of every 10 health care dollars spent in the US.
- Heart disease and stroke are the most lifethreatening consequences of diabetes. Adults with diabetes have heart disease death rates 2 to 4 times higher than those without diabetes. Other complications of diabetes are vascular damage, blindness, kidney disease, and amputations.
- These groups are several times more likely to have type 2 diabetes as whites of similar age:
 - Hispanics, 1.9 times
 - African Americans, 2 times
 - American Indians & Alaska Natives, 2.6

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Diabetes Prevention Program Research Group "Reduction in the Incidence of Type 2 Diabetes with Lifestyle Intervention or Metformin" New England Journal of Medicine 2002; 346: 6, 393 –403.

This study evaluated 3234 non-diabetic persons at 27 centers with high risk factors for diabetes: elevated plasma glucose concentrations in the fasting state and after an oral glucose load, overweight, and sedentary lifestyle. Participants represented the diverse US racial and ethnic population at risk for diabetes. They were randomly assigned to one of three regimes: placebo (control group), metformin (850 mg twice daily), or a lifestyle modification program with goals of 7% weight loss and at least 150 minutes of physical activity per week. Assignment to metformin and placebo were double-blinded. Participants were followed an average of 2.8 years. Incidence of diabetes was 11.0, 7.8, and 4.8 percent in the placebo, metformin, and lifestyle intervention groups respectively. Lifestyle intervention reduced incidence of diabetes by 58%, more than the 31% reduction achieved with metformin in persons at high risk. http://content.nejm.org/cgi/content/full/346/6/393 Follow link to past issues.
