Hispanics are now the largest minority population in this country, comprising 14% of the US population with 38.8 million in the US and 3.8 million in Puerto Rico.

Description: The article discusses disparities in the medical treatment of Hispanics. Key findings were that Hispanics have less access to medications and to advances in medicine, have genetic and other factors that effect metabolism of medications, often have coexisting conditions that affect optimal dosage, and face cultural and communication issues that impact drug therapy. Reported research showed variations in drug metabolism and optimal dosage among Hispanic subgroups. The report proposed four key recommendations for reducing disparities and improving access to pharmaceutical therapy for Hispanic patients.
